CELEBRATING AMAZING WINE AND DOG ART—MUTT LYNCH WINERY DEBUTS ITS NEWEST ARTIST SERIES RELEASES

(Windsor, CA, August 22, 2018)—Mutt Lynch Winery proudly announced the debut of its newest Artist Series wines at a recent Winemaker and Artists Reception at the winery's tasting room.

The Artist Series showcases very limited production wines of Owner and Winemaker Brenda Lynch and the amazing artwork of three talented Northern California artists-- Christie Marks, Glenyse Henschel and Barbara Lawrence.

In keeping with the winery's core mission of supporting local non-profits, 25% of Artist Series proceeds will be donated to the Sebastopol Center for the Arts.

An encounter with Catherine Devriese, Director, Visual Arts Program for the center by Chris and Brenda Lynch at a Chinese "Year of the Dog" exhibition was the spark to partner up to identify the artists and artwork to be selected for the new series.

"When we launched our first Artist Series wines 10 years ago, we never realized how enduring the concept would be. People immediately responded to how the artwork and the wine complemented each other, and reflected our collective passion for all things dog. We think the new artwork is brilliant and will evoke the same enthusiastic reaction" said winery Owner and Winemaker, Brenda Lynch.

The Artist Series wines are all hand-crafted and hand-selected with Brenda personally sourcing select lots and barrels. Included in the collection are the "Innocent" 2014 Sonoma County Cabernet Sauvignon, "Girly Girl" 2016 Sonoma County Pinot Noir and "Pure Joy on the Beach" 2016 Sonoma County Roussanne. All wines are extremely limited in production with fewer than 50 cases produced for each label.

The Artist Series along with the winery's other special collections – Wines That Give Back and Leader of the Pack are all expected to be featured prominently as stunning gifting opportunities during the 2018 holiday season.
