#### 2012 mbf Zinfandel, Perotti Vineyard Dry Creek Valley—Sonoma County

The flavor profile is classic Zinfandel--and includes notes of black peppers, black cherries and plums. Yum, yum, yum.

## Perotti Vineyard, Dry Creek Valley

I first met Ed and Bruce Perotti , father and son grape growers in Dry Creek Valley, in 1997. I immediately fell in love with their Zinfandel vineyard and have been producing small amounts of wine from their grapes ever since. Located on the north end of Dry Creek Valley, on a bench with an eastern slope, this location ensures great air circulation and exposure, dry skins and ripe fruit. As they say in real estate and winemaking—location, location, location!

### Brenda's Winemaking

**Handle with care**. My Zinfandel was treated to gentle winemaking and oak aging. Fermentation took place in an open-top tank, with hand punch-downs. This approach prevents harsh tannins from being imparted to the wine and allows the wine to be fruit-forward. My 2012 vintage was aged in 100% French Oak barrels for 18 months.

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### **Tasting Notes**

Our 2012 mbf Zinfandel has a lovely garnet color and opens to wonderful aromas of black pepper and cherries. The flavor palette is predominated by black cherries and plums. In keeping with the characteristics of this beloved varietal, the tannins are moderate and the acidity is relatively high. The result is a bold wine that is light to medium bodied and with a smooth mouthfeel. This is a lovely and balanced wine.

Our suggested food pairing, one of our favorite Sichuan dishes--Siu Yuk (crispy pork belly)

This "mbf" is just waiting to come home with you!
